# Meet Tony Allain (Presenting in May)

"My passion will always be the landscape, it is why I became an artist. I want to share my vision of the world I see. Color and light is my motivation for choosing a subject. The light sparkling on the water, the color reflected in the landscape. I favor the early morning or late afternoon to capture these effects. My art is simply a collection of moments. I think an artist has to allow his surroundings to reveal itself, before the artist can reveal their vision of the way they see the world onto others."


Tony Allain is a Scottish-based artist. He is an award winning painter, instructor and author and has been painting for over 50 years. He is a member of the Pastel Society of London, a member of the Royal Society of Marine Artists, among others. He is a painter of color, light and movement with a complete understanding of his surroundings. Born and raised in the Channel Islands, he studied life drawing from observation and painting from life. He moved to paint and live in Cornwall to capture the unique clarity of light living on the peninsular of the West Country. Tony has exhibited extensively over the years; his work can be found in many leading galleries as well as private and corporate collections worldwide, including the Maritime Museum, Guernsey and Queen Mary 2, and Cunard Liner. He has exhibited with The Pastel Society of America in New York; the Royal Society of Marine Artists, London; The International Pastel Exhibition; Suzhou, China; and the Pastel Society, Mall Galleries, London. A move to New Zealand in 2006 proved to be a turning point in his career with the acceptance as a Master of the Pastel Artists of New Zealand. He is also a Signature member of the Pastel Society of America and was elected an Eminent Pastelist of the International Association of Pastel Societies. Tony's work is regularly featured in The Artist Magazine, the Pastel Journal and the Practique des Arts.

Tony now lives and works in Scotland.





# 13 Tips for Better Pastel Paintings Suggested by Tony Allain

According to award-winning pastellist, Tony Allain, "many artists aspire to a faster, looser style."

I've learned that the first step to interpretive freedom is to develop your confidence as a painter. Tony shares the following 13 tips for better pastel paintings designed to strengthen your skills and improve your results.

- Use the best-quality artist's pastels. Inferior materials result in inferior paintings.
- Carry a sketchbook and make thumbnail sketches.
- Stand at your easel, if possible. You'll have more freedom of movement.
- Lay in the underpainting using the side of the pastel and broad, direct, light strokes.
- As you look at your subject, squint as much as possible, which allows you to see the shapes rather than the details.
- Paint what you see, not what you think you know is there.
- Paint "fat over lean," as you would in oil—that is, heavy over light, or soft over hard.
- Paint the highlights last to keep them clean and bright.
- Read books, watch DVDs and take workshops with artists you admire. You'll
  acquire a lot of knowledge, but follow that with effort. Without a heap of practice,
  this knowledge will amount to nothing.
- Try to put a stroke down and never touch it again.
- Use your photo references to explore different ideas. Draw on them with marker pens. Add acrylic in some areas. Crop, cut and move things around until you find inspiration.
- Work quickly. It teaches you to think before you make your mark.
- Finally, have fun and enjoy the expressive medium of soft pastel.
